ALTAR & ROSARY MEETING: The Altar & Rosary Sodality will have their first meeting since November of 2019. It will be held on Tuesday, November 2nd following the 8:30 AM morning Mass in the hall beneath the church. Please note the time and place of this meeting. It will be a daytime meeting and will take place in the lower level of the church since the homeschool group will be having their usual monthly meeting in the parish hall. This is an important meeting – the future of the Altar & Rosary Sodality will be one of the topics of discussion. All women are welcome.

NOVEMBER 1ST: November 1st is the Solemnity of All Saints. It's normally a Holy Day of Obligation. But when it falls on the day before or the day after a Sunday, it is not. The reason being the complex problem of anticipated Masses of either Sunday or the Holy Day interfering with one another. The Bishops of the United States have placed three Holy Days in this category: Mary the

Mother of God (January 1st), Assumption of Mary (August 15), and All Saints (November 1st). The Solemnities are celebrated on those days but the obligation of Mass attendance is dispensed with. The Solemnities of the Immaculate Conception (December 8th, the patronal feast of the United States) and Christmas (December 25th) remain Holy Days of Obligation no matter what day of the week they fall on. Actually, there are 10 Holy Days of Obligation in the Catholic Church worldwide. In the United States permission was given to transfer 5 of them to the nearest Sunday. This was because of the difficulty of celebrating them in a pluralistic culture that treats them as ordinary workdays.

MASS OF REMEMBRANCE: The annual Mass of Remembrance is being held at St. Peter Church in La Porte this year on Tuesday, November 2nd at 7:00 P.M.. We will pray for and remember all our beloved deceased from Holy Family Parish (Sacred Heart, St. Joseph & St. Peter churches), St. Anthony of Padua Parish and St. John Kanty Parish from this past year. Those families and friends who mourn the loss of their loved ones are invited to come to this beautiful annual service. The Mass will also be live streamed on the Holy Family Parish Facebook page and the Holy Family La Porte site on YouTube.
