FOOD PANTRY NEWS: St. John Kanty church collects non-perishable food that is distributed at the Community Food Pantry of Galena, Hudson, Kankakee and Wills Townships. In 2021, the pantry served 131 families who were in need. During part of the pandemic the pantry items were boxed up and delivered to the clients directly to their cars. The pantry is now back to in person shopping. Most of what we give to families comes from your donations. We also receive food from the USDA and purchase meat and supplies from the Food Bank of Northern Indiana at a much lower costs than retail stores offer. Monetary donations help us purchase food items and supplies (such as toilet paper) to fill in what is needed to meet clients' needs. The Pantry Board also holds several fund raisers each year. Our volunteers and Board thank you for your support. Most importantly, our local families in need are blessed by your responses to their physical needs. Donations may be dropped off in the St. John Kanty hall beneath the church when you come to Mass. Many thanks for your past and continuing support, of this outreach program to needy families.

St. Anthony Food Collection: St. Anthony Parish collects food for the needy and take it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society in La Porte for distribution. In the past food has been requested on a monthly basis, but contributions have fallen off substantially. It was thought that by being able to bring donations in on a weekly basis instead of monthly might facilitate the collection process. Hopefully it will be easier to remember to bring your donations if they can be brought anytime you come to Mass. Any items left in the back of church will be removed to the parish hall following Mass. If possible, however, it would be helpful if they could be brought to the parish hall. Just place them on one of the tables near the entrance to the kitchen. We thank you sincerely for your past donations. The need to restock St. Vincent de Paul's pantry is great. It disappears all too rapidly. Whatever you can spare toward the ministry of feeding the hungry is much appreciated.
