

THE DISCIPLINE OF LENT

FASTING:

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age through to those who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday.

THE CUSTOMARY FAST:

This fast allows for only one full meal to be taken during the day. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

THE FAST OF THE EARLY CHURCH:

This fast begins upon rising, NO meals are taken until the customary workday (5pm) is ended. A glass of juice may be taken in the morning and simple liquids such as water, coffee and tea during the day. The fast ends with a brief prayer followed by an adequate meal. For many this may work as a more natural way to fast.

ABSTINENCE:

Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and above.

TRADITIONAL ABSTINENCE:

This is the practice of refraining from meat and meat products.

ABSTINENCE AS PENANCE:

Entering fully into the spirit of the Lenten Fast and Paschal Fast, we are also encouraged to abstain from other foods, practices or activities.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Wednesday, February 14th, is the beginning of the holy penitential season of Lent. Ashes will be given following Mass. Mass at St. Anthony will be at 8am and at St. John Kanty at 6pm.

LENTEN MASS & STATIONS OF THE CROSS

St. Anthony and St. John Kanty Churches will be having Mass and Stations of the Cross on Fridays of Lent. Mass and Stations at St Anthony will be at 8am and at St. John Kanty at 6pm.

ST. STANISLAUS IN NEW CARLISLE CELEBRATES GORZIE ZALE

St. Stanislaus Kostka in New Carlisle, celebrates Gorzkie Zale "Bitter Lamentations," on Sundays of Lent at 11:15 am Eastern Time. This devotion that was developed in the 18th Century in Poland is a set of hymns that focus on the Passion of Christ. It is sung every Sunday during Lent and is a constant reminder of the sadness of Christ's death. The hymns are prayed before the exposed Blessed Sacrament, and concludes with Benediction.
