Reader:

All the paths of the Lord are kindness and constancy toward those who keep his covenant and his decrees. The friendship of the Lord is with those who fear him, and his covenant, for their instruction.

Leader:

Let us light the first candle on our wreath and sing our Advent Wreath song.

The first purple candle is lit before and left burning during the evening meals on each day of the first week in Advent.


