GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I am particularly struck by this line from Solomon's prayer in today's first reading from the Book of Wisdom: "Or who ever knew your counsel, except you had given wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high?" Solomon doesn't seem to be seeking direct answers to the questions he presents today, but rather, uses them as a sort of poem of praise to honor God in all his glory. In modern language, we could rephrase his questions: What do we know that God has not instilled into our minds? What wisdom do we have that was not infused by the Holy Spirit? There are many things that we cannot understand without the wisdom God gives us. May we, like Solomon, praise and thank God for this gift. Let us trust that where our feeble, corruptible humanity falters, our heavenly Father is our refuge in every age.

GO EVANGELIZE | PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT road and for sanctity. Jesus does not mince his words, nor does he seek

Today's Gospel is certainly one that we need God's wisdom to understand. This reading always makes me do a double take or a read-over. "What did Jesus just say?!" His words today are stark and can feel disconcerting. "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." When I encounter a challenging Scripture such as this one, I try to immediately root myself in concrete truths about the Lord. First, I acknowledge that he is good and desires my good. He is all-knowing, all-powerful and all-loving. After centering on those realities, I can look at this Gospel again, but this time through a clearer lens. Ultimately, this Gospel is a piercing reminder of the radical renunciation desired by the Lord. It is a rubric for the narrow

road and for sanctity. Jesus does not mince his words, nor does he seek to confuse or confound: to follow Jesus is to release our hearts from earthly attachments, to embrace our cross and to set our lives in proper order. Clear and direct? Certainly. Easy? Not at all. But doing this in union with Jesus? *Absolutely possible*.

REFLECT

Today, consider reflecting on your attachments – the places you cling to anything that is not Christ. As you go into these tender places, invite Jesus to gently reveal where he wants to grant you his freedom.



PASTORAL PLANNING PROCESS 2025

From August 2025 through December 2025 our parishes, along with a number of others, will be participating in a Diocesan facilitated process known as *Pastoral Planning*. This is an extremely important undertaking designed to help us meet the future sacramental and pastoral needs of our communities.

Earlier this year, we invited you to participate in an anonymous parish survey. Your input helped us to better understand the beliefs, practices, needs, and desires of our communities. Thank you for taking the time to share your feedback.

What is "pastoral planning"?

Pastoral Planning is a prayerful, strategic process by which a group of parishes take inventory of the human and financial resources of their community and realign them to meet the future sacramental and pastoral needs.

Is "pastoral planning" just a fancy way of saying that parishes are going to close?

While some parishes may close and merge with other nearby parishes, this is not the driving force behind pastoral planning. In order to maximize talents and resources, some church buildings may close or remain open as a worship site while the parish operations merge with another parish. Other parishes may remain, grow in their operations or remain unchanged depending on the sacramental and pastoral needs of the local community.

Who makes the decisions in this process?

Bishop McClory is the ultimate decision maker as the shepherd of the Diocese of Gary. To reach his decision, Bishop McClory is seeking a recommendation from the parishes within each planning area. Each pastor has appointed three Key Parish Leaders to serve as advisors to explore the current ministry landscape, review future strategies for an effective Catholic presence in the area, and formulate recommendations for Bishop McClory's consideration.

The bishop has appointed Fr. Christopher Stanish, Vicar General; Fr. Jeff Burton, Northlake Dean; and Deacon Brad Hendrickson to facilitate the *Pastoral Planning Process*.

St. Anthony's Key Parish Leaders are: Andy Chlupacek, Karoline Emerick, and Beverly Noel.

St. John Kanty's Key Parish Leaders are: Pete Cook, Roslyn Davila, and Joyce Forbes.

Our two parishes are in the LaPorte/Starke Grouping and encompasses eleven parishes. Six meetings are scheduled as part of the Pastoral Planning Process and will be held at Holy Family Parish, Sacred Heart Campus (201 Bach Street in LaPorte). Four will be with Key Parish Leaders and two will be open meetings (September 11th and October 30th) in which all parishioners are encouraged to attend and participate. All sessions will be on Thursday evening and run from 6 to 8 pm.
