

## LENTEN MASS & STATIONS OF THE CROSS

St. Anthony and St. John Kanty Churches will have Mass and Stations of the Cross on Fridays during Lent. Mass and Stations at St Anthony will be at 8am and at St. John Kanty at 6pm.

## EXPERIENCE "THE RESCUE PROJECT"

Join us for an 8-week journey to discover the 4-part story of the Gospel: Created, Captured, Rescued, and Response. This is essentially a presentation of the retreat the priests of our Gary Diocese attended together last May. They said that it was one of the most powerful presentations that they had ever experienced and recommended that a version of it be made available to the people of our Diocese. Whether you are a life-long Catholic or new to the Faith, this journey offers a powerful message of hope through video and community discussion. ## THE DISCIPLINE OF LENT

### FASTING:

Fasting is to be observed on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** by all Catholics who are 18 years of age through to those who have not yet celebrated their 59<sup>th</sup> birthday.

### THE CUSTOMARY FAST:

This fast allows for only one full meal to be taken during the day. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

### THE FAST OF THE EARLY CHURCH:

This fast begins upon rising, NO meals are taken until the customary workday (5pm) is ended. A glass of juice may be taken in the morning and simple liquids such as water, coffee and tea during the day. The fast ends with a brief prayer followed by an adequate meal. For many this may work as a more natural way to fast.

### ABSTINENCE:

Abstinence is to be observed on **Ash Wednesday** and **all Fridays of Lent** by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and above.

### TRADITIONAL ABSTINENCE:

This is the practice of refraining from meat and meat products.

### ABSTINENCE AS PENANCE:

Entering fully into the spirit of the Lenten Fast and Paschal Fast, we are also encouraged to abstain from other foods, practices or activities.

## CGS & CCD CLASSES



**DRIVERS:** Please be careful and stay alert when navigating the parking lot or dropping off children for CGS/CCD classes. Children may unexpectedly dash across the lot, so proceed with caution.

**STUDENTS:** Exercise care when walking to the Parish Hall for classes on Sundays. Always watch for moving vehicles in the parking lot, as drivers may not easily spot you.
